Presently they are reaching out to children with day retreats with simple teaching using flannelgraph, Christian materials, and songs. Johney and Juni are doing this work amid the challenging temperatures in the 40's C. We know there will be lasting results from this ministry which reaches thousands of children of all ages. My heart is full of thankfulness that we are privileged to work with faithful people chosen of God for this hour. This is absolutely not possible without your faithful prayers and financial support.

### Ps. Johney from Faith and Vision Ministries

Thank you for your prayers, encouragement and support. This year we, together with the twelve pastors in our fellowship, have baptized over 60 people so our churches are growing.

On our missions trip to Jharkhand, North India in March, we reached three people groups, some in tribal areas, with 1000 children attending. Our children's summer camps in our own area ministered to 1200 children, listening eagerly, and 300 adults were in our teachers' training classes. All were in high temperatures. All glory to Jesus, for it was good seed sown in tender hearts, which without your prayers and support could not be done. Thank you again.



#### Samuel John and son Juni ...

Our ministry is going along well for which we praise the Lord! Thank you very much for the help we receive from GNLM. It has been very challenging working with the villages and Children's Day VBS programs in very high temperatures, with humidity. In five places over 1200 children have been reached with songs, skits, puppets and flannel graph over a 3 days period. In each place many children came to the Lord. We expect to reach another 1200 kids in the coming weeks.



We are happy that you enabled us to get more trolleys for the leprosy village folk. They are unable to go out to beg due to the high temperatures and two have died of malnutrition with all of them struggling to survive. We travel distances to visit them bringing bags of necessities and groceries. They are very

grateful. House of Hope children have all done well (even the two boys from Yenada who have never been to school) and have been promoted to higher classes. Juni and I continue to travel to many places bringing the good news of the Gospel. Thank you very much for your prayers and support. We are very grateful. Please pray for us.

### Pastor Samuel Paul reports...

Our fifteen blind people are real prayer warriors, mornings and evenings, and they memorize

Bible verses, sing very well, and listen to audio Bible tapes. I'm very proud of them. But they

are very housebound and cannot go anywhere safely. Our 17 year-old van is not safe, but very

worn out and needs replacing. If you would kindly help us replace it then we can use it for visits

for our blind, leprosy and disabled persons. We really need a reliable vehicle for our ministry.

My son Ian Barrie is very interested in helping these people with a heart of compassion, and

humbly requests assistance for this needed vehicle. He drives well. Thank you very much for

your valuable prayers and financial support
